1. Purpose. To issue a complete revision to the Projected Operational Environment (POE) and the Required Operational Capabilities (ROC) for SACRAMENTO (AOE 1) Class of fast Combat Support Ships.

2. Cancellation. OPNAVINST 3501.10A.

3. Discussion. Enclosures (1) and (2) have been prepared per reference (a). The ROC and POE provide the necessary details to describe the mission areas and operational capabilities for which the SACRAMENTO (AOE 1) class fast combat support ship was designed and are organized. Together, the ROC and POE establish personnel requirements requisite for developing the Ship's Manning Documents (SMD).

4. Information. The Chief of Naval Operations has approved the AOE 1 class ROC and POE. Initial distribution has been made to commands concerned.

5. Action. Fleet Commanders in Chief are requested to periodically review enclosures (1) and (2) and recommend to the Chief of Naval Operations (Attn: OP-375) changes as may be appropriate when capability of the class is significantly altered by introduction or deletion of systems.

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PROJECTED OPERATIONAL ENVIRONMENT  
FOR AOE 1 CLASS AMMUNITION SHIPS

1. At sea in wartime.
2. Capable of performing all defensive functions simultaneously while in Readiness Condition I.
3. Capable of performing other functions which are not required to be accomplished simultaneously.
4. Continuous Readiness Condition III at sea. Missile battery may be manned during underway replenishment.
5. Conduct underway replenishment in support of operating forces by simultaneously providing POL from 6 stations (2 starboard and 4 port); ammunition, provisions, stores, fleet freight, mail, personnel and other items from four stations (one starboard and 3 port); for periods normally not to exceed 32 hours per week. For purposes of SMD development, UNREP hours are considered to commence with the "first line over" and terminate with "last line clear". All other workload such as rigging prestaging of cargo, safety briefings, etc., will be counted under Utility Tasks and Evolution (UT&E).
6. Conduct vertical replenishment in support of operating forces by providing ammunition, stores, fleet freight, mail, personnel and other items with assigned helicopters or helicopters from other units for periods normally not to exceed 32 hours per week. This includes the time from the setting of flight quarters to securing from flight quarters.
7. Capable of performing all maintenance for which ship's company is responsible.
8. Capable of supporting embarked underway replenishment group staff subject to constraints imposed by existing installed shipboard communications equipment.
9. To operate in company with a carrier task force.
