SECNAV INSTRUCTION 5451.1A

From: Secretary of the Navy

Subj: Policy and Organization, Marine Corps-Navy Supply
at Marine Corps Air Activities

1. Purpose. This Instruction promulgates policies and assigns responsibilities for Marine Corps and Navy supply functions at Marine Corps air activities.
2. Cancellation. SECNAVINST 5451.1.
3. Discussion. To promote economy and avoid duplication of effort in Marine Corps and Navy supply operations, there is a need for guidance on the organization and division of supply responsibilities at Marine Corps air activities. General Order No. 17 deals with similar relationships between Marine Corps supply and Navy supply organization, however, its application is limited to Marine Corps activities which are tenants at naval activities.
4. Policy. A single supply department organization will be maintained at Marine Corps air activities to perform both Marine Corps and Navy supply functions. Military command and coordination control will rest with the commander of the Marine Corps activity. It will be jointly manned to the extent that Marine personnel will be assigned to supply functions specified as Marine Corps responsibilities and, as the availability of properly qualified personnel permits, to a limited number of subordinate billets within areas of Navy responsibility to meet training and shore duty rotation requirements.
5. Responsibilities
 - a. Commander, Naval Supply Systems Command exercising authority delegated by the Chief of Naval Operations and the Chief of Naval Material will have technical control of supply matters at these stations except for the following Marine Corps and Navy supply functions which will be under the technical control of the Commandant of the Marine Corps:

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(1) Marine Corps property section for procuring and furnishing to station squadrons, Fleet Marine Force units in garrison and all station functions, all authorized items peculiar to the Marine Corps plus the following groups of supplies authorized by the USMC Material Allowance List or the USMC Material Allowance List Supplement:

- Clothing
- Weapons and ordnance parts and equipment
- Ammunition, lubricants and cleaning and preserving materials for Marine Corps furnished weapons
- Individual equipment
- Musical instruments and accessories

(2) Food service operations and program.

(3) Uniform clothing sales.

(4) Issue commissary operation, general mess, and bakery where authorized.

(5) Household effects.

b. The Commandant of the Marine Corps will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of laundries and commissaries and the initial outfitting and replacement of collateral equipment therefore. The Commandant of the Marine Corps will also be responsible for the operation and maintenance of other station facilities and equipment including minor construction, major repair and collateral equipment, except facilities and equipment which remain the responsibility of the Navy or of tenant units.

c. All material or service, except commissary and subsistence stores, authorized for procurement with Marine Corps operating and maintenance funds in connection with Marine Corps responsibilities at Marine Corps air activities shall be obtained by requisition or purchase through the station Navy supply activity.

d. Procurement lead time for all expense-type materiel for base operations will be financed through stock fund appropriations, including requisitions which are passed from one supply point to another.


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e. The Commander, Naval Air Systems Command as directed by the Chief of Naval Operations and the Chief of Naval Material, will ensure that Integrated Logistic Support planning is accomplished on all systems/equipment furnished by NAVAIR to ensure timely and adequate logistics support.

f. The Comptroller of the Navy has technical control of disbursing functions. The Commandant of the Marine Corps is responsible for disbursing for all local military and civilian payrolls and other local collection and disbursing requirements.

6. Organization. Guidance for achieving organizational uniformity among the activities affected by the policies stated herein will be provided by the Commandant of the Marine Corps and the Systems Commanders exercising technical control.

7. Action. The Commandant of the Marine Corps, the Chief of Naval Material and the Systems Commanders concerned exercising authority delegated by the Chief of Naval Operations are authorized and directed to implement the policies and responsibilities promulgated in this Instruction on receipt.
