SECNAV INSTRUCTION 6320.22

**Subj:** MONITORING THE PROVISION OF MEDICALLY RELATED SERVICES TO HANDICAPPED CHILDREN IN DOD DEPENDENTS SCHOOLS (DODDS)

**1. Purpose.** To provide Navy Department policy for monitoring the provision of medically related services to handicapped children enrolled in, or eligible to be enrolled in, Department of Defense Dependents Schools as required by reference (a).

**2. Applicability.** This instruction applies to Navy medical treatment facilities providing medically related services to handicapped children in DODDS, and all Medical Department personnel assigned to serve on monitoring teams.

**3. Background**

**a.** The delivery of medically related services to qualified handicapped children is mandated by references (b), (c) and (d).

**b.** Reference (a) directs military departments to participate in a DOD program to monitor the provision of those medically related services and provides for the establishment of joint service monitoring teams.

**4. Policy.** It is DON policy to support the DOD program to monitor the provision of related services to qualified handicapped children in accordance with provisions of reference (a).

**5. Responsibilities**

**a.** Director of Naval Medicine (OP-093) will:

(1) Exercise oversight of monitoring activities on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.

(2) Ensure that appropriate recommendations of monitoring teams are implemented.

**b.** The Commander, Naval Medical Command, will:

(1) Assign qualified Navy personnel to each monitoring team as required by reference (a).

(2) Provide coordination and support for team members in making travel arrangements to Navy sites as required by reference (a).

(3) Program sufficient resources to execute the subject monitoring function as assigned to the Department of the Navy.

**c.** Geographic naval medical commands to be visited will arrange for accommodations, work space, and local transportation for team members, and will advise base commanders of pending arrival of monitoring teams.
