Subj: DISESTABLISHMENT OF CENTER OF MARITIME DOMINANCE (CMD)

1. Purpose. To approve disestablishment of Center of Maritime Dominance (CMD) under the administrative chain of command of the Chief of Naval Operations per reference (a).

2. Background and Mission. CMD's mission has been to train Atlantic and Pacific Fleet carrier/expeditionary strike groups and theater assets in the areas of integrated Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) and Surface Warfare (SUW) in order to increase warfighting proficiency in support of Fleet Response Training Plan (F RTP). With the establishment of the new CNO-directed Fleet ASW Command, CMD's mission has been incorporated into that larger command.

3. Organizational Change. Disestablish Commanding Officer, Center of Maritime Dominance effective 1 October 2004.
