Subj: CHANGE TO THE ORGANIZATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF
NAVAL OPERATIONS (OPNAV), DEPUTY CHIEF OF NAVAL
OPERATIONS (WARFARE REQUIREMENTS AND PROGRAMS) (N6/N7)
AND OCEANOGRAPHER OF THE NAVY (N096)

1. Purpose. To announce changes to the organization of the
Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV), Deputy Chief of
Naval Operations (DCNO) (Warfare Requirements and Programs)
(N6/N7) and Oceanographer of the Navy (N096).

2. Background

a. Oceanography is a unique element of the U.S. Navy's
portfolio, and the Navy's continued future success is closely
tied to better understanding the battlespace environment in
which the Navy operates.

b. Alignment of the Oceanographer of the Navy (N096) to
DCNO (Warfare Requirements and Programs) (N6/N7) will strengthen
the Oceanographer of the Navy's position within the Navy, will
reflect the importance of understanding the ocean environment,
and will ensure that capabilities provided by the Oceanographer
of the Navy are integrated fully in Sea Power 21.

3. Organization Changes. Effective immediately:

a. All functions and resources of N096, Oceanographer of
the Navy, are aligned to N6/N7. N096 is disestablished.

(1) Mission statement for N6/N7 is revised to read: To integrate, assess and program Battle Force requirements for all warfare disciplines in consonance with the construct of Sea Power 21; to develop and deliver the Integrated Strategic Capability Plan (ISCP) and Sponsor Program Proposal (SPP); to develop an integrated warfare relationship both inside and outside the DON, especially with Fleet Forces Command (FFC), other fleet and force commanders and their subordinates, and the Joint staffs; and to articulate the relationship between Naval programs and the associated warfighting capability to OSD and Congress.

(2) N6/N7 is assigned as Command Assist Official (CAO) for the Superintendent, U.S. Naval Observatory in lieu of N096. Responsibilities of CAOs are described in reference (a).

(3) Enclosure (1) is the revised OPNAV Organization Chart.

b. Oceanographer of the Navy

(1) N61 will serve as the principal advisor to N6/N7 on Navy oceanography matters and programs. N61 will also advise N6/N7 and CNO on high-level issues regarding oceanographic and academic research.

(2) N61 is assigned additional duty as the Oceanographer of the Navy.

c. Senior National Representative

(1) Responsibility to serve as the U.S. Navy's Senior National Representative (SNR) in discussions with foreign nations regarding cooperative science and technology projects, previously aligned to N096 in 1998, is realigned to N6/N7 in the Office of the Deputy for Warfare Integration, N7F.

(2) Mission and functions for N7F are at enclosure (2).

(3) Resource sponsorship for SNR is transferred from N096 to N6/N7.

(4) N7F is assigned additional duty as the SNR.

3. Action

a. Chief of Naval Operations (N6/N7) will:

(1) Within 60 days of the date of this Notice, submit to Director, Navy Staff (DNS-3/N09B1) revised mission and function statements, and organizational structure for N6/N7 and its divisions and staff offices.

(2) Within 60 days of the date of this Notice, submit manpower documents to Director, Navy Staff (DNS-3/N09B1) to align military manpower from N096 to N6/N7. This will include adding an additional duty assignment for N7F as SNR.

(3) Within 60 days of the date of this Notice, submit Standard Forms 52 to Assistant for Civilian Personnel and SES Policy, N1M, to align civilian manpower from N096 to N6/N7.

(4) Within 60 days of the date of this Notice, revise N-code organization information in the NMCI Global Address Listing and on HQWeb to reflect current organization alignments.

(5) Within 180 days of the date of this Notice, revise directives under the cognizance of N096 to reflect the alignment of functions to N6/N7.

b. Chief of Naval Operations (N00F) will reflect the following additional duty assignments in the Flag Roster:

(1) N61 as Oceanographer of the Navy; and

(2) N7F as the Senior National Representative.

c. Chief of Naval Operations (DNS) will:

(1) Revise reference (a).

(2) Submit TFMMS changes to Director, Field Support Activity to reflect alignment of N096 billets to N6/N7. This will include an additional duty assignment for N7F as SNR.

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(3) Coordinate with CNO (N1M) to align civilian billets from N096 to N6/N7.



Mission: To execute the Naval Capabilities Development Process (NCDP) from synthesis of Strategic Guidance through development and delivery to N8 of the N6/N7 Sponsor Program Proposal; to serve as the Navy's Senior National Representative (SNR) to harmonize U.S. Navy armament requirements with our allies' requirements, identify opportunities for cooperation, and improve coalition warfare interoperability; and to develop and update the Naval Transformation Roadmap.

Functions:

1. Develops supporting documents for the Naval Capabilities Development Process including Mission Capability Package analysis and briefings, Naval Capability Pillar briefings, and an Integrated Strategic Capability Plan (ISCP).
2. Oversees Platform Wholeness Reviews, Sponsor Program Proposals and various "endgame" reviews.
3. Coordinates with N6F to ensure space, C4ISR and enterprise matters have strong representation within the NCDP.
4. Serves as Executive Secretary of the Technology Oversight Group (TOG), established to integrate and assess Future Naval Capabilities, and align resources and investment strategy to address capability needs arising from the Sea Power 21 pillar. Represents N6/N7 in the S&T arena.
5. Represents CNO and the Navy in various bilateral and multilateral meetings and forums such as the NATO Naval Armaments Group, Five Power SNR Forum and the Maritime Theater Missile Defense Group. Works closely with N3/N5 and Office of Naval Research to develop a coherent approach to individual countries and groups.
6. Enhances capability harmonization and interoperability with allies through representation of required coalition warfare capabilities within the NCDP.

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7. Serves as resource sponsor for SNR, specifically Program Elements 0605853N, International Cooperative RDT&E (R0149) and 0603790N, NATO Research and Development (R2293).

8. Serves as the Navy's front-line transformation voice delivering presentation to a variety of audiences including Congress.
